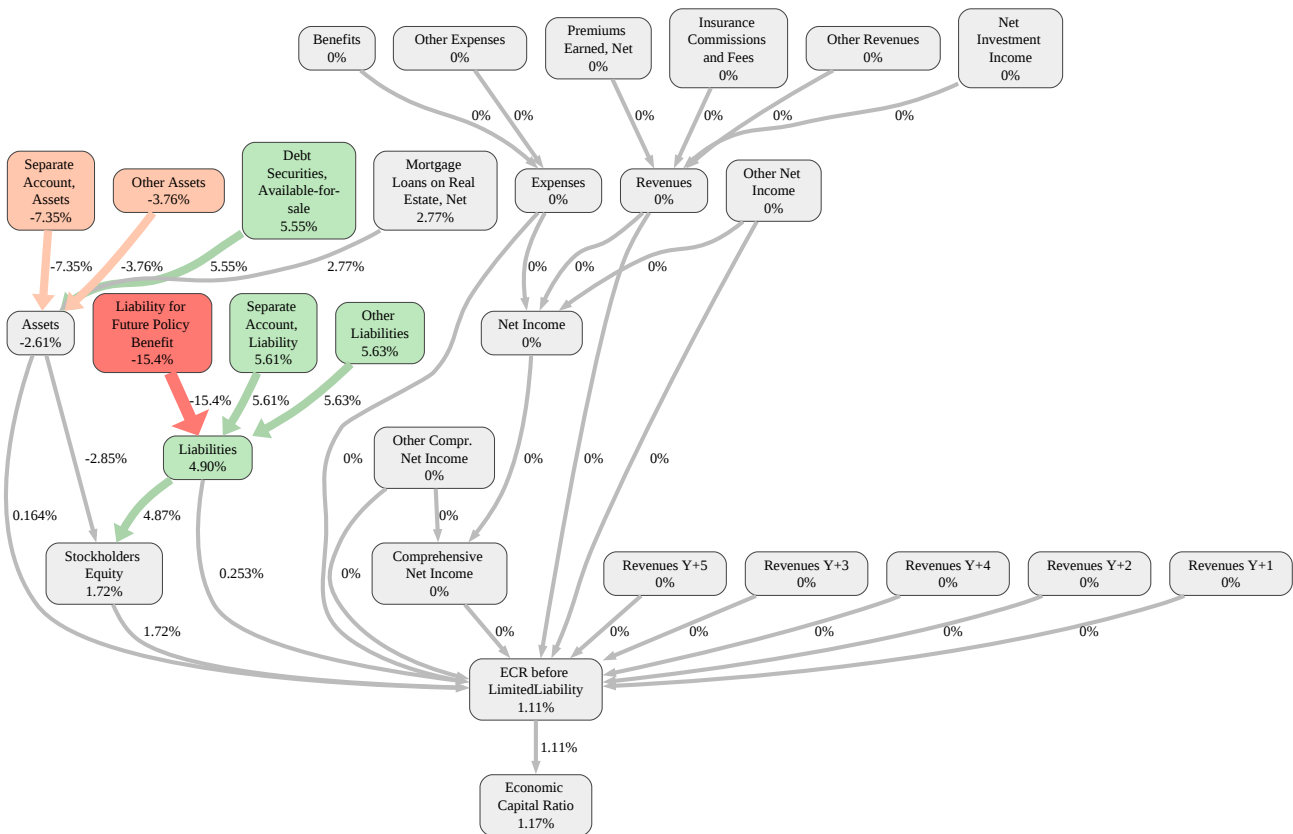




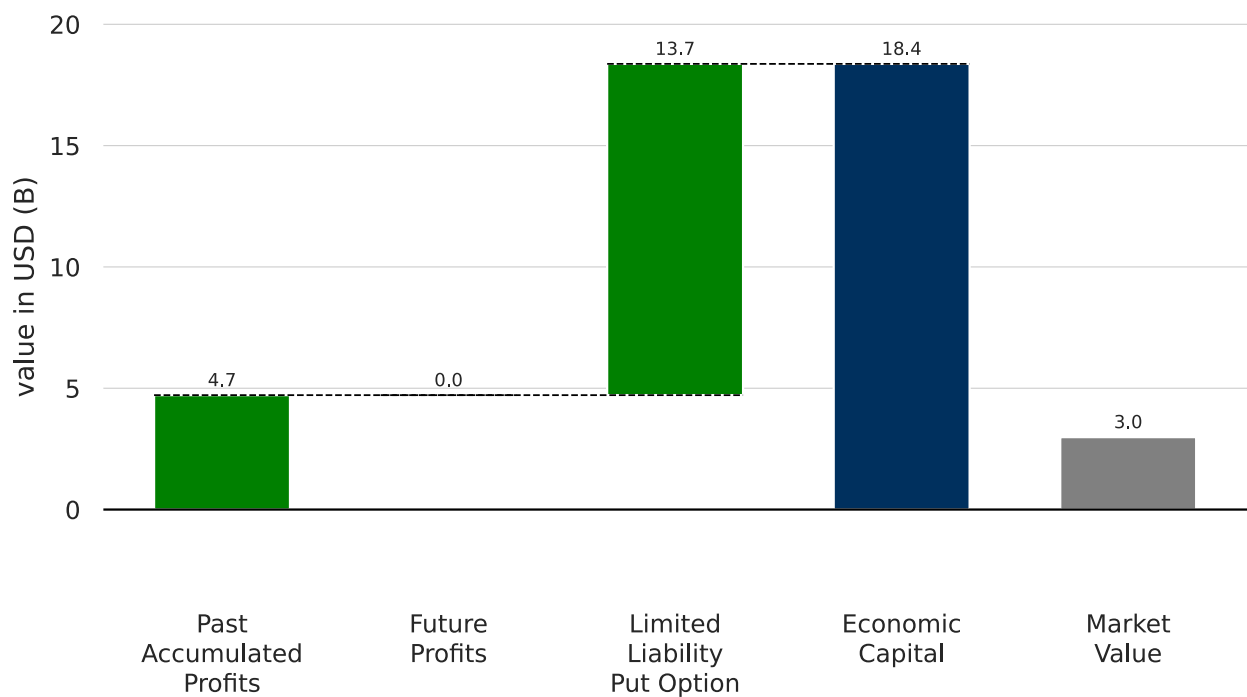
The relative strengths and weaknesses of Genworth Financial INC are analyzed with respect to the market average, including all of its competitors. We analyzed all variables having an effect on the Economic Capital Ratio.

The greatest strength of Genworth Financial INC compared to the market average is the variable Other Liabilities, increasing the Economic Capital Ratio by 5.6% points. The greatest weakness of Genworth Financial INC is the variable Liability for Future Policy Benefit, reducing the Economic Capital Ratio by 15% points.

The company's Economic Capital Ratio, given in the ranking table, is 22%, being 1.2% points above the market average of 21%.

Company Valuation: Genworth Financial INC

The RealRate Economic Capital of a company is its Past Accumulated Profits plus its Future Profits plus its Valuation Correction plus its Limited Liability Put Option. Past Accumulated Profits and Future Profits can be negative. The Limited Liability Put Option accounts for the limited liability of the shareholders, so the Economic Capital never falls below zero. Where the company is listed, its market value is shown next to it.
